<p>Students may take Special Topic electives (4393) such as Slavic Religion, Russian in Film, Propaganda, or other topics and independent study courses to complete the minor. They also may do a capstone project focused on Russia and in a major program that will also count for Russian Studies program credit. These are taken with specific approval of the topic by the Russian Studies Committee. Students with Russian area courses from previous study are encouraged to transfer the credits into the program.</p>		
<p>The study of Russian language is neither expected nor required for this minor.
