Patricia Scroggs has been the Director of the Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Program since January 2006. She is based at Howard University and manages the program under a grant from the U.S. Department of State. She is a retired Foreign Service Officer who has served in positions around the world, including in Asia and Latin America.

The Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Program is a State Department-funded program that seeks to attract and prepare young people for careers in International Affairs. The Rangel Graduate Fellowship Program provides benefits of up to \$90,000 over two years toward a two-year master's degree, arranges internships on Capitol Hill and U.S. embassies, and provides professional development and support activities. Fellows may use the fellowship to attend any good two-year master's program in an area of relevance to the Foreign Service, including international relations, public policy, or business administration. At the end of the two-year fellowship, Fellows enter the Foreign Service of the U.S. Department of State. Applicants must be college seniors or graduates, have GPAs of at least 3.2 and be U.S. citizens. The Rangel International Affairs Summer Enrichment Program is a six-week program at Howard University that helps prepare undergraduate students for careers in international affairs. It includes three for-credit academic courses, visits and meetings with foreign affairs professionals in a wide range of government and non-governmental activities, and professional development activities. It pays for tuition, room, board, and transportation and provides a stipend. Information and application materials for both programs are at www.rangelprogram.org.
