For UT School of Medicine at San Antonio, 3 of the 14 hours of required Biology coursework **must** be Biochemistry (taught in either a biology or chemistry department). Biochemistry is strongly recommended by all other TMDSAS schools. Courses for non-science majors or for health career majors **are not accepted**.

^g The Calculus course can be any calculus course taught by a Math or Physics department. Business Calculus or any Pre-Calculus courses **are not accepted**.
