- Keep Your System Patched

- Install and Use a Firewall Program
- Make Backups of Important Files and Folders
- Use Strong Passwords

- Use Care When Downloading and Installing Programs



Social Networking Security Tips

Protect Yourself by Socializing Safely Online

- It is your responsibility on how you are perceived by others
- Protect Privacy: Don't share personal or family information
- Post only information that is appropriate for the entire public
- Don't reveal personal information usernames
- Posting inappropriate photos can lead to damaged reputation and unwanted attention
- Posting inappropriate photos can damage your professional careers
- Be aware that your profile can be seen in some way, regard less of your private or public settings
- Once information is posted online and deleted or modified, the original will never be completely deleted



Phishing Security Tips

Protect Yourself from Phishing Scams!

- Don't respond to suspicious or "phishy" e-mails
- Don't click on links within the "phishy" e-mails
- Check the legitimacy of the links
- Don't enter your personal or financial information
- Resist the urge to react immediately without thinking
- NEVER, will banks, schools, and other legitimate institutions, request for your personal information via e-mail



Malware/Spyware Security Tips

Protect Yourself from Unwanted Programs on your computer

- Install and Use Anti-Virus & Anti-Spyware Programs
- Be cautious of large e-mail attachments
- Be cautious when downloading software from websites
- Configure your Internet Browser to be Secure
- Don't click on Pop-Up Advertisements
- Read your license agreements before installing software
- Be aware of free downloadable software
- Be aware of e-mail links claiming to offer anti-spyware software
