Core Curriculum Substitutions for Honors Coursework:

Upon completion of the four-course honors sequence (HNRS 1391, 1392, 2391, 2392) and the Contemporary Problems Seminar (HNRS 4395), the student will be credited with fulfilling 15 credit hours in the core curriculum as follows:

- English (ENGL 1341)
- History (any course)
- Social Science (any course)
- Either of the third courses in theology or philosophy
- Synthesis Course

No course may be applied to the mathematics, natural science, language, oral communication or fine arts block of the core curriculum.

English Requirements for Entering Freshmen in Honors:

- Students with no English transfer credit take 1342, 2312
- Students with 3 hours of English transfer credit take 2312
- Students with 6 hours of English transfer credit need no additional English core.

Independent Research Project

- Upon completion of the Independent Research Project (HNRS 4394), students will receive 3 credit hours in their major field.
- Students must consult their department chair to determine what course in their major is eligible for credit.

Students Who Withdraw from the Honors Program

- A student who leaves the Honors Program after completing one course will receive credit for the honors course as an elective. It will NOT fulfill any core curriculum requirements.
- A student who leaves the Honors Program after completing two or more courses may designate the appropriate blocks in the core curriculum requirements to which to apply the honors credits.
