DEGREE PLAN OPTIONS: CONCENTRATION WITH OR WITHOUT A THESIS OR PROJECT

Course	A total of 36 credit hours is required for the MLA degree		
MLA seminar 1	Completion of 9 credit hours of MLA seminars (three courses with MLMLA designation, excluding Thesis/Project courses) is required of all students. Seminars vary each semester in discipline and topic and are open to graduate		
MLA seminar 2	students only. Students choose seminars based on academic goals and interests and may take these at any time prior to degree completion.		
MLA seminar 3	MLA seminars are offered in the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. See the current course schedule for a list of seminar courses.		
Concentration course 1	A minimum of 18 and a maximum of 21 credit hours in a particular discipline/area of study are required for a concentration. For example, a student pursuing a concentration in Art History must complete any 6 courses (18 hours)		
Concentration course 2	 Students pursuing the Irish Studies, Social Justice Studies, Public Administration, or Medieval Studies concentration will complete a prescribed set of courses. Students pursuing the Interdisciplinary Studies concentration can choose courses from multiple disciplines/areas of study based on their

Concentration course 5	 Any credit hours in the concentration beyond the maximum allowed (7 courses, 21 credit hours) will not count toward the MLA degree requirements. 		
Concentration course 6	The limit of 21 credit hours reflects the interdisciplinary nature of the Master in Liberal Arts degree that requires students to take courses in multiple disciplines/areas of study within the humanities and social sciences.		
Elective 1 or Concentration Course 7	3 additional credit hours may come from a student's concentration or an elective from another discipline.		
Elective 2 or Thesis/Project Part I	The 6 remaining hours may come from either 2 electives or a thesis or project. Completion of a thesis or project is optional.		
Elective 3 or Thesis/Project Part II	The thesis or project is usually undertaken and completed in the last two semesters of the student's MLA graduate studies.		

<u>Additional Graduation Requirements:</u>

- All students must fulfill the *capstone* requirement. A student may fulfill this requirement by [a] submitting a
 graded paper from a MLMLA seminar course; [b] submitting a paper presented at a conference; or,
 [c] completing a 6 credit hour Thesis or Project.
- A *minimum* **GPA** (overall) of 3.0 is required to graduate.
