

Viewing Attempts Statistics


The purpose of most surveys is to determine the percentage of those surveyed who responded with the various answers to different questions. Surveys are not limited to gauging opinions: They can also reveal what participants believe to be facts, as in “45% of students surveyed correctly found Egypt on a blank map.”

To view overall test or survey results:

1. Under Control Panel, click **Grade Center**, then **Full Grade Center**. (*NOTE: Even if a Survey is not included in grade calculations, it gets its own column in the Full Grade Center grid.*)



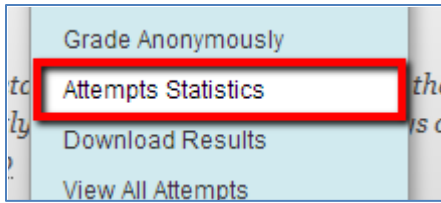
2. Click the contextual menu for the column.
