



MASTER OF EDUCATION (MEd) COUNSELOR EDUCATION PLUS LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR AND/OR PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATION

PROGRAM DETAILS FOR LPC

Upon the completion of the School Counselor courses, students can take 4 additional course to be eligible to take the National Counseling Exam to become a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC). LPC is an other counseling credentials that allows for community work, clinical services, and private practice.

Students are strongly encouraged to speak with the school counseling director to ensure the appropriate courses are completed. Students who started the school counseling program after August 1, 2017 will need to complete a minimum of four additional classes to meet the 60 credit hour threshold required by the licensing board. The following courses elective courses meet the licensure requirements.

Students who started a counseling program before August 1, 2017 are required to complete a minimum of 48 hours of specific counseling coursework and will need to speak with the program director for advisement on the necessary courses.

PROGRAM DETAILS FOR PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATION

Upon completion of the School Counselor courses, students can take 4 additional course to be eligible to take the TExES Principal Exam for principal certification in the state of Texas. Principal certification is typically used for all administrative positions, from assistant principal to assistant superintendent in Texas K-12 schools.

This option is only for current or future school counseling candidate. If you have already graduated from our program or any other school counseling program, you are not eligible for this option.
