

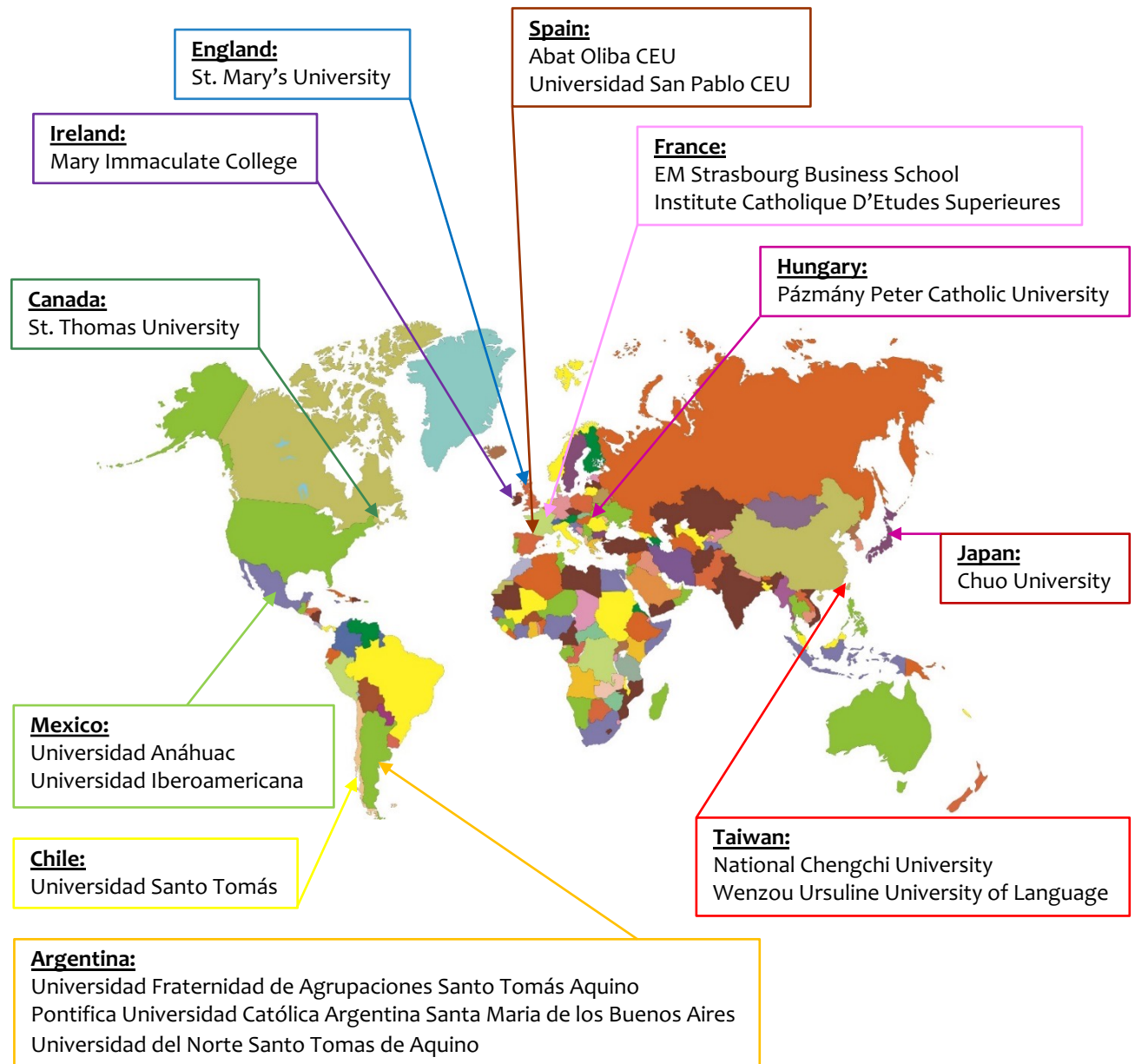
INDIVIDUAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS (SISTER SCHOOLS)

ABOUT INDIVIDUAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

- Formal exchange partnerships with select universities around the world allow UST students to study abroad and vice versa.
- Tuition is paid to UST but courses are taken overseas.
- Financial aid can generally be used (but always check with the Financial Aid Office.)
- Courses taken overseas count as **institutional UST credit** upon return (i.e. with grades and grade points)
- Courses taken at the partner school are considered “in residence” at UST.

INDIVIDUAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS (NON-EXCHANGE)

ABOUT INDIVIDUAL NON-EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

- Students wishing to study at a non-partner institution can consult with the Study Abroad office.
- Courses must be individually approved and will be treated as **transfer credit** (no grade points)
- Tuition is paid directly to the host institution.
- Financial aid use is limited. (but always check with the Financial Aid Office.)
- Courses taken are **not** considered “in residence” at UST (and cannot be taken in the last 36 hours).
